All new students must first start their enrollment process [online](#) by applying to one of the nine colleges. Once a completed application is submitted, a new student will receive a unique identification number and LACCD email address. Students then go to the [student portal](#) page (MyCollege.laccd.edu), create a new password and click on the “Manage Classes” (add/drop) icon to enroll in classes at any of the nine colleges.

If you want to enroll as a first-time, full-time student as part of the L.A. College Promise program, use your new student ID to fill out the short “[interest form](#)” at the [Los Angeles College Promise Program](#) website and you will be contacted after submitting the form. It’s that easy, but students may enroll in the Promise Program by August 1 to qualify.

In addition to the tuition-free education, LACP students also receive:

- Priority registration for classes
- Dedicated academic counseling and coaching support
- Additional financial support and access to emergency aid funds
- A free laptop
- Access to job opportunities with Amazon
- Help to transfer to the California State University system for a four-year degree
