Who Do I Contact?

Campus or District Administration for:

Discrimination and/or Harassment Based on: Race, Color, National Origin, Religion, Sex/Gender, Physical or Mental Disability, Age (40+), Genetic Information, Marital Status, **Sexual Orientation and** Identity, AIDS/HIV Status, **Medical Condition, Military or** Veteran Status, or Status as a Victim of Domestic Violence, Assault, or Stalking Under California Law

The role of LAPC's Deputy Title IX Coordinator is to:

- Provide information about available Campus and District options, including the LACCD complaint process
- Explore potential response measures, including campus-specific options, such as a Mutual No-Contact Order
- Help parties contact the Campus Sheriff
- Help parties file a complaint with LACCD to initiate an investigation
- Explore options for Early Resolution of complaints
- Connect parties with resources, on and off campus
