Academic Standards, Loss of California College Promise Grant and Enrollment Priority

The Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) is dedicated to supporting students in their educational pursuits. There are many options to support your academic success and to assist you in regaining good academic standing. Good Acad & Prog	You are in good academic and progress standing. You have a cumulative
Standing	grade point average of "C" (2.0) or higher in all course work completed at the LACCD and the percentage of grade entries of "W" (Withdrawal), "I" (Incomplete), and "NC/NP" (No Credit/No Pass) is less than fifty percent (50%).
Probation 1 st Semester	You are on 1 st semester probation. You have attempted at least 12 semester units of course work and have a cumulative grade point average of less than a "C" (2.0) and/or the percentage of grade entries of "W" "I" and "NC/NP" is at least fifty percent (50%).
Probation 2 nd Semester	You are on 2 nd semester probation. You have a cumulative grade point average of less than a "C" (2.0) and/or the percentage of grade entries of "W" "I" and "NC/NP" is at least fifty percent (50%) for two consecutive semesters.
Probation Subject to Dismissal	You are subject to dismissal. You have been on academic and/or progress probation for three or more consecutive semesters and are facing dismissal from the LACCD the forthcoming semester.
Probation Dismissal	You are on probation dismissal. You have been on academic and/or progress probation for the past three consecutive semesters. You have maintained a cumulative grade point average below "C" (2.0) and/or the cumulative percentage of units in which you have been enrolled is at least fifty percent (50%) of grade entries of "W", "I", and "NC/NP." If you are dismissed from any one LACCD college, you will be disqualified
	To be re-admitted to one or more of the Los Angeles Community College District's colleges, you must wait two semesters before requesting readmission.

Loss of California College Promise Grant and Enrollment Priority

The Student Success Act has changed the way in which students qualify for the California College Promise Grant, formally known as the Board of Governor's Fee Waiver (BOG). A student eligible to receive a California College Promise Grant shall loose eligibility if they are placed on academic or progress probation for two consecutive semesters. Loss of eligibility shall become effective at the first registration opportunity after such determination is made. Students will also be placed in the lowest enrollment priority group.

Appeal Procedures

Students have the right to appeal the loss of eligibility for the California College Promise Grant and enrollment priority. To do so, please contact your Admissions and Records Office to obtain the appeals form. The appeals form will describe the basis and process to appeal.

DSP&S students may have accommodations that address the loss of eligibility for the California College Promise Grant and enrollment priority. Please visit the DSP&S office at your home college for details.

Removal from Academic and Progress Probation

A student shall be removed from **academic probation** when his/her cumulative grade point average is 2.0 or higher.

A student shall be removed from **progress probation** when the percentage of units in which entries of "W" (Withdrawal) "I" (Incomplete), "NC" (No Credit), "NP" (No Pass) are recorded drops below fifty percent (50%).

The above policies are in accordance with Los Angeles Community College Board Rule, Chapter VIII, Article II.
