COVID-19 STATUS



- California “Re-opening” occurred June 15
- Most health orders and protocols for Institutes of Higher Education (IHE) now retired
- Alignment of remaining orders from CDC, State Health, Cal/OSHA & County Health occurred in June
- Updated messages sent to all District employees
- LACCD working on “de-mobilization” reports for District Emergency Operations Center and Colleges’ Incident Command Centers
- Keeping close watch on Delta variant for any impacts / changes

COVID-19 STATUS: VACCINATIONS



LACCD Colleges Hosted More than 60 Vaccination Clinics in June

- College incentives to students—food gift cards, bookstore credits
- Foundation & Kaiser teaming up, gifting students up to \$150 for vaccinations
- More clinics planned for July



FALL RE-ENGAGEMENT PLANS



- Revisions to Health Orders and Protocols open way for more on-site instruction and student services
- No restrictions on class sizes
- No required social distancing
- Indoor masking & self screen still required
- District /Colleges using phased-in approach for return this summer and Fall semester
- Consultation with employee groups continues
