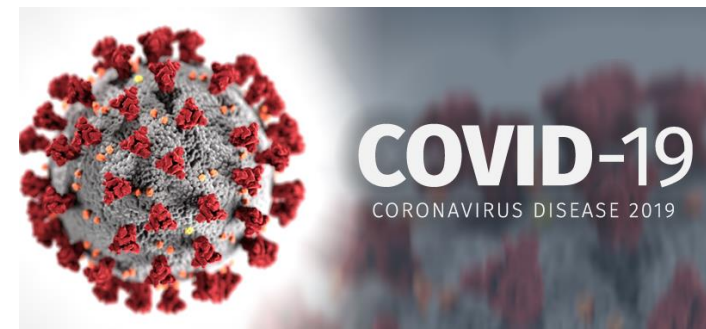
CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

COVID-19 / STATISTICS



As of October 7, 2020:

- We remain in a declared state of emergency due to the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic—Now at Day 204
- Six-month milestone occurred September 19, 2020 just as the nation recorded more than 200,000 deaths
- Fall 2020 Semester began Aug. 31 with return to limited on-campus instruction for specific classes to support California's essential services workforce infrastructure
- Chancellor announcement in September to all faculty, students and staff that educational delivery and business operations must remain in remote environments and online for Winter and Spring 2021





As of October 7, 2020:

L.A. County stats

- 275,856 positive cases, 6,681 deaths

In LACCD:

- 169 positive cases
- 1 fatality (no change)

L.A. County remains in state's most restrictive Tier 1 Status due to tracking data.

Health Officials expect status to remain same in October
